Southern Banks Discovery Drive

Pinette to Cape Bear 46 km / 29 m

Red cliffs offer a dramatic welcome to ferry passengers arriving from Nova Scotia. This 46km route also features the Island's only winery, a historic lighthouse, two Provincial Parks and several red and white sand beaches, as well as three distinctive Heritage Roads carrying travelers back to pioneer days.

- ★ #11 - **Simon's Beach. (A4)** Small beach with scenic location.
- ★ #12 - **Wood Islands Ferry Terminal and Harbour. (A4)** Gateway to Eastern Prince Edward Island for arrivals from Nova Scotia on ferries operating May - December.
- ★ #13 - **Wood Islands Lighthouse and Interpretive Museum (1876). (A4)** Houses over 200 historic artifacts telling the story of lighthouse keepers.
- ★ #14 - **Wood Islands Provincial Park and Beach. (A4)** Day park featuring playground, unsupervised beach, flush toilets, boat ramp and picnic facilities.
- ★ #15 - **Plough the Waves Centre. (A4)** First stop for arrivals from Nova Scotia. Houses Tourism Information and picnic area. Email/internet access. Entry point to cycle and walk Confederation Trail.
- ★ #16 - **Northumberland Provincial Park and Beach. (A3)** Popular 76-acre site has camping, lifeguard, and playground with program activities for children.
- ★ #17 - **Panting's Shore Beach (Off Rte.4) (A3)** Shallow red sand beach No Facilities.
- ★ #18 - **Rossignal Estate Winery. (B3)** On cliffs overlooking the Northumberland Strait, offers vineyard and winery tour, display of Island artistry, and award-winning fruit wines. On-site purchasing in Little Sands.
