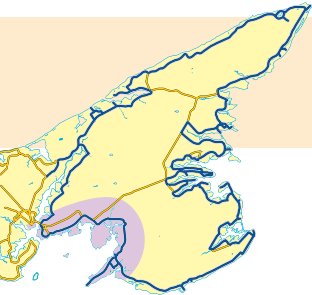
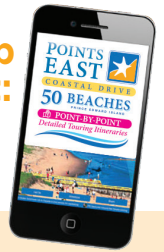


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Orwell Bay #HomeoftheSundayDrive Stratford to Pinette 60 km / 37 m



Destination of the Island's original Scottish settlers in 1803, this historic region is ideal for genealogy buffs, birders and cultural enthusiasts. In a 60km stretch, you'll find the Island's oldest church and other historic sites, several fishing and agricultural communities, Scenic Look Offs and beaches, plus a lighthouse, three golf courses and a living agricultural museum.

- #A1** - **Pondside Park.** (B7) 11 acres of open and wooded areas with a small stream and Hatchery Pond. Variety of recreational activities.
- #A2** - **Fox Meadow Golf & Country Club.** (B7) 18-hole golf course. Championship layout offers a visual mix of community, rural and harbour views.
- #A3** - **Fox Golf Academy.** (B7) State-of-the-art golf teaching facility.
- #A4** - **Keppoch Road Beach.** (B7) Off Rte. 26. Red sand beach. No facilities.
- #A5** - **Tea Hill Park & Beach.** (B7) Off Rte. 26. Red sand beach. Facilities.
- #A6** - **Vista Bay Golf Course.** (C6) 9-hole golf course.
- #A7** - **Waterside Road Beach.** (A6) Off Rte. 1. Waterside Road Beach is a small beach in Pownal Bay. Off the beaten path for usual beach goers and as such it's nice and secluded - A perfect get-away place to unwind. No facilities.
- #1** - **Orwell Corner Historic Village.** (C5) 1890s Agricultural Heritage Museum and Scenic Look Off consists of a blacksmiths, general store, church, school, animals and barns.
- #2** - **Sir Andrew Macphail Homestead and Macphail Woods.** (C5) MacPhail Park Rd., 2km off Route 1 at Orwell. This 140-acre estate includes a museum reflecting 1864-1938, nature centre and trails.
- #3** - **The Polly Monument.** (B5) Recognizes the Scottish Selkirk settlers. In Belfast, at the Island's oldest church, St. Johns Presbyterian.
- #4** - **Croft House Selkirk Cultural and Heritage Centre.** (B5) Replica of a croft house, the story of the 1803 Selkirk settlers and nearby, the Church of Scotland (1876), and the Pioneer Cemetery of St. Paul.
- #5** - **Belfast Highland Greens.** (B5) A 3,209-yard 9-hole golf course placed along the side of one of the largest cliff systems in P.E.I.
- #6** - **Lord Selkirk Park.** (B5) Arrival location of the Island's Scottish settlers. Gardens, swimming pools, miniature golf, camping, stage, annual Highland Games.
- #7** - **Polly Pioneer Cemetery.** (B5) This Mount Buchanan cemetery is the resting place of many original Island settlers from Scotland -- a boon for genealogists and history buffs.
- #8** - **Point Prim Lighthouse & Beach (1845).** (A6) Island's oldest and only conical brick lighthouse. Houses a unique display of the Island's nautical history. A Classified Federal Heritage Building.
- #9** - **MacAuleys Wharf.** (B5) MacAuleys Wharf Rd. Small working wharf.
- #10** - **Pinette Provincial Park, Beach and Wharf.** (B5) A day use park featuring picnic facilities, flush toilets, playground equipment, fishing and riverside beach.
- #10A** - **Pinette Wharf.** (B5) Small scenic wharf.
- #10B** - **Ponds Road Beach.** (A5) Off Rte. 1. On Ponds Road, natural beauty. Ponds Road Beach is easily accessed and provides room for parking.
- #10C** - **Big Point Road Beach.** (A5) Off Rte. 1. This hidden gem is an ideal location for beach combing and hunting for sea glass.
